The Alpha Delta Phi Society's 16th Convention and Leadership and Training Conference was hosted by the Bowdoin Graduate Chapter this past summer in Brunswick, Maine.

In stark contrast to the snow at Binghamton, siblings from around the nation and from both the Fraternity and Society joined with Bowdoin graduate members to enjoy the sweltering heat and humidity that is July in Maine.

The traditional Convention business sessions were supplemented by social activities, including allowing attendees the chance to enjoy a presentation curated by the Bowdoin Library Special Collections department, who displayed a wide array of both Chapter and College material that highlighted the lives of various Bowdoin Alpha Delts, with a particular emphasis on Bowdoin's most famous son, Joshua Chamberlain, and others from the Chapter who fought in the Civil War.

A special thank you to Terrie Eastmade, Bowdoin '97 for all of her hard work at headquarters! Max Morant, University of Pennsylvania 2016, is the first recipient of the award! As a member of the Society for three years, he spent his tenure as an undergraduate holding chapter positions such as President and Treasurer. He then went on to serve as an Undergraduate Governor and Vice President of the Society's Undergraduate Parliament.

Star and Crescent Award

The Star and Crescent Award is awarded by the Society Board of Governors to a graduate member who has made an outstanding contribution to the Society; it is the highest distinction bestowed upon a graduate member of the Society.

This year, Chad Wolfsheimer, Brunonian 2000 and David Clodfelter, Bowdoin 1989 were chosen as recipients of this honor.

Chad served as the fourth President of the Alpha Delta Phi Society from March 2012 to March 2015. As President, he oversaw the expansion of the Society at SUNY Plattsburgh, George Washington University, and Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute. He also nurtured a significant increase in the number of members who took an active role in national Society leadership. Leading our change from Conventions focused on presentations to ones focused on discussions, he empowered everyone to suggest and take on issues and projects important to them and their chapter or affiliate. Chad has also been an active member of the Brunonian Chapter.

David has served the Alpha Delta Phi Society with distinction. As a member of the Board of Governors, David has served as Treasurer. He has also offered timely legal and policy counsel and direction, playing a key role in our strategy on many subjects and in developing many of our policy statements. He also is a long-time member of the Bowdoin Graduate Organization's Board of Directors and serves as Treasurer. He has played a key role in keeping the Graduate Organization going strong since the undergraduate chapter was closed in 2000.

Undergraduate Parliament Update

For years, the Undergraduate Parliament has helped undergraduate chapters share expertise and knowhow through educational leadership events such as Undergraduate Caucus, and provided a forum for undergraduates to share the Alpha Delta Phi Society experience on an interchapter level through events such as Undergraduate Retreat.

Monthly calls allow chapter presidents to plan programming for undergrads and discuss matters such as branding and recruitment. The Undergraduate Parliament also works on projects that engage the interests of siblings from different chapters in collaborative production: Undergraduate Governor Andy Richards, Brunonian '17, is working with a diverse team to publish an undergraduate literary magazine. Our latest efforts include individual chapter check-ins between chapter presidents and Parliament leadership. This has allowed us to connect chapter officers with resources to ensure the success of their chapter, increase Chapter Support's bandwidth for keeping in touch with individual chapters, and create a space for supporting the officers who commit their time and energy to improving their chapters.

In the next semester, we plan to guide chapters through important processes, and to impart the wisdom of experienced members onto newer chapters. For instance, Undergraduate Governor Bre Tyrell, Ursinian '17, has been cataloging the information found on each chapter's websites to create a template of essential information to include while making new websites.

off the evening on Friday, along with the traditional awards banquet on Saturday evening.

The highlight of the Convention for many was the presentation given by siblings Edie Smith, Diane Hastings, Nicola Beisel, and Jayne Deane-White, who gave a lively discussion of what it was like to re-open the Bowdoin Chapter in 1976 as a fully coeducational institution.

Sibling Smith was the first female president of the Bowdoin Chapter, and her inspirational speech about the equality and respect that she experienced as a member and leader of the Alpha Delta Phi held everyone rapt and brought many to tears.

She concluded the presentation by asking all the other women in the room who had also been President of their chapters to join her on stage, resulting in the remarkable photo on the first page, which represents only a tiny fraction of the women who have served in leadership positions over the last 40-odd years.
